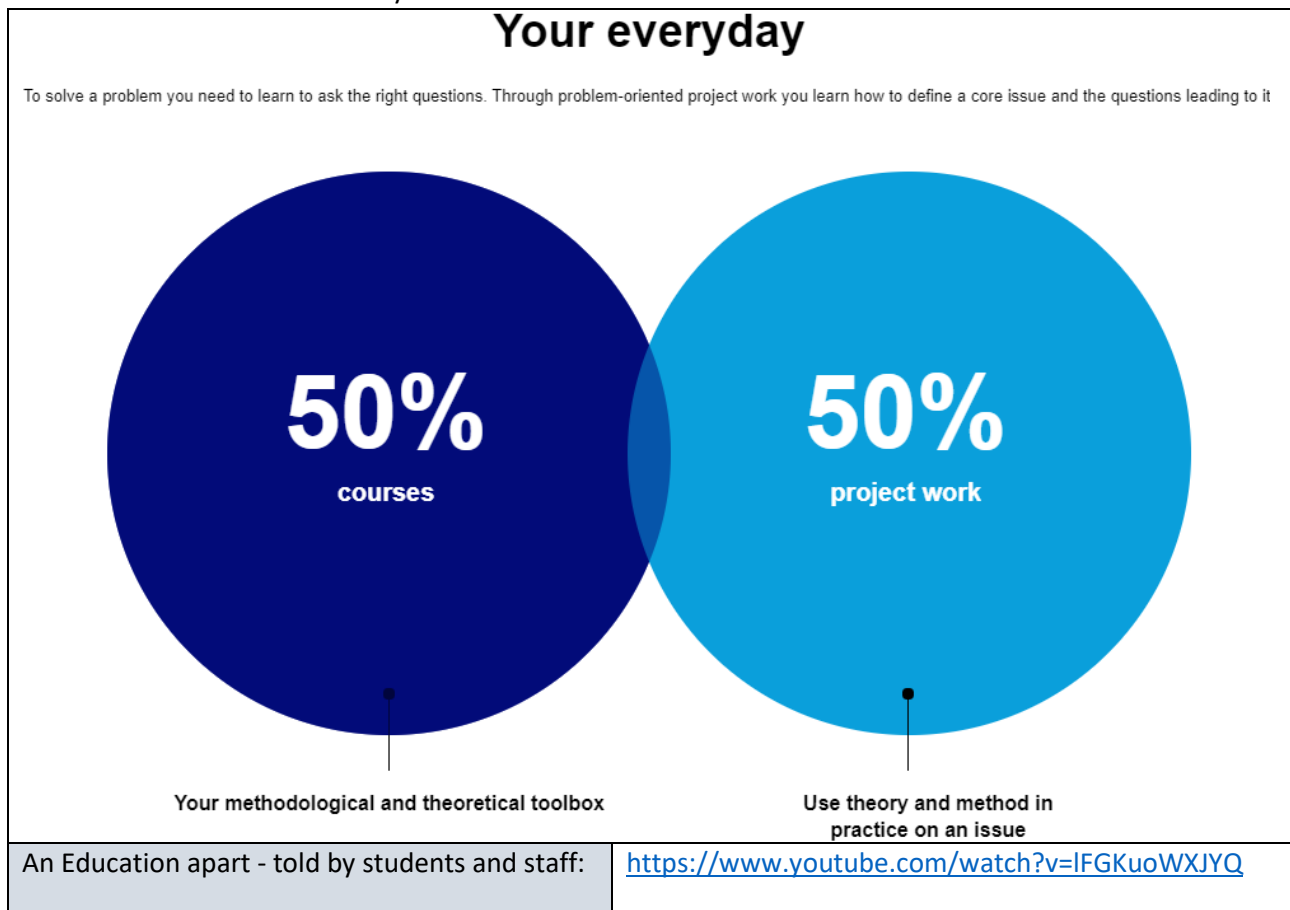

Semester start

Group formation process	<p>It is very important that the student arrive at Roskilde University in time to participate in all study activities from semester start (1 September/1 February). Normally there will be group formation days within the first week, where students find the subject of the project and team up in project groups.</p> <p>Group formation days are usually a 2-3 days long process, where you spend the days talking about subjects for the project, facilitated by academic staff. By the end of the 2-3 days, students will have narrowed the subjects for the project into a very specific title that the project will be focused on and the team up in groups. At this time groups will register together for the exam as a project group.</p> <p>The process gives students possibilities to influence the subject and feel out fellow students, as they have to work closely together for the whole semester on the project. Is not possible to do a project alone.</p>
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Admission requirement

General	<p>Nominated students will receive an e-mail with a guidance on the application process and a link to our online application form. You will be required to upload the following documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learning Agreement signed by you and your home university • Transcript of records from your home university • Documentation for English proficiency (see below)
Language requirements	<p>Students need to prove English proficiency. You can find the accepted tests and minimum scores at our web: https://ruc.dk/en/admission-exchange</p> <p>Students exempted from English skills requirements: If your current programme is 100 % taught in English we just need a signed document from your home university stating that your current studies is 100 % English taught.</p> <p>Countries exempted from English skills requirements due to: Equal national admission requirements for universities in countries as in Denmark:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finland • Netherland • Norway • Sweden <p>Currently studying in a native English-speaking country:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Australia • Great Britain • Ireland • New Zealand • USA
Minimum study activity requirement	<p>30 ECTS - which is considered a full-time study. It is possible to take more than 30 ECTS - however, we only recommend 30 ECTS each semester. Note that you normally will have to make an exam when finishing each course – it could be a written assignment or an oral examination.</p>
Restrictions	<p>Exchange students should mainly choose their courses within the agreed field of study. Whether or not they are allowed to take courses within other fields depends on their academic background and course availability.</p>

Semester packages	<p>We have made semester packages for incoming exchange students for all English taught programmes. They will always be available for an academic year at our website. Level	<p>BA = bachelor level MA = master level</p> <p>It is possible for master students to do study activity at bachelor level, however it is not possible for bachelor student to do study activity at master level</p>
Is it possible to do activities at home	<p>As you are required to do 30 ECTS at Roskilde University, it is not possible to do additional activities at your home university (e.g. thesis) at the same time.</p>

RUC Housing	<p>Roskilde University has secured a limited number of rooms for our exchange students on campus: https://ruc.dk/en/accommodation-exchange-students We do not give guarantees but normally we are able to accommodate most exchange students who applied before the deadline. Exchange student will receive information on campus accommodation after being accepted.</p>
Price level per month	<p>RUC Housing: DKK 3300-5000 (€ 440-670) Food: DKK 1500-2000 (€ 200-270) Books: DKK 250-500 (€ 35-70) Transportation: DKK 660 (€ 90) – if you commute to the university In total you should expect to use approximately DKK 8000 (€ 1070) per month</p>

Residence permit/visa

Non-EU citizens	<p>You must apply for a residence permit before arriving in Denmark.
